

Cook to present IU's history, Part 2



When retirees gather in November, they will hear from **Brad Cook**, curator of photographs at the IU Archives. In January, Brad led retirees on a fascinating photographic journey through IU history up to the time of Herman B Wells. By popular demand, we'll finish

the year with Part 2 of his well-received presentation.

Brad has been with the IU Archives for more than 30 years. He earned a bachelor's degree in history and an MLS from IU.

We'll meet at the IU Foundation at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 8. If you wish to join the meeting remotely, you must register at the IURA website to receive your personalized Zoom link.

Retirees visit University Collections

"If you take care of things, they will last," said **Alisha Beard**, engagement coordinator for campus art. On Oct. 11, retirees gathered at McCalla School for an overview of University Collections and to experience some of the changing exhibits.

University Collections is relatively new. The brainchild of then President Michael McRobbie, its purpose is "take care of things," to identify and steward collections across IU. "We don't manage the

When University Collections began in 2018, IU was thought to be home to some 50 collections. Since then, more than 250 have been identified across



the university. These include everything from the Archives of Traditional Music and the Bloomington Drosophila Stock Center (IU Bloomington) to Ars Femina, celebrating women composers (IU Southeast), and the Calumet Regional Archives (IU Northwest).

The historic McCalla School, on East 10th Street between Indiana Avenue and Dunn Street, has been remodeled to showcase exhibits from some of these collections. The bright and airy facility officially opened its doors in August 2022 with six galleries. One displayed the Kinsey Institute's Bettina Rheims

collection of photography that subverts gender stereotypes. A seventh gallery, about science, is being developed and will open Nov. 3.

The multipurpose room currently displays nearly 50 works by the late Rudy Pozzatti, with carefully written interpretative labels providing a deeper understanding of each piece. This exhibit will run through at least December 2024.

Several retirees particularly enjoyed the gallery with works by eminent lithographer Morton C. Bradley. A great-grandson of IU's renowned 19th-century professor Theophilus Wiley, Bradley bequeathed his geometric sculptures to IU. "Visitors can marvel at and learn from the intricacies, the science and beauty of his work displayed throughout, some on counters, some on pedestals, some suspended from the ceiling," IURA member **Bonnie Brownlee** said. The IU Collects app is "fantastic for providing a digital record of an exhibit," Alisha said. More than 300,000 objects have been digitized and preserved already.

Bonnie is an enthusiastic user of the University Collections website. "You could spend the day weaving your way through and experiencing the museum at your own pace," she noted. "Audio, video, 3-D presentations: It's all there in a wonderfully user-friendly format."

The McCalla School is open without charge Tuesday through Friday, from noon to 5 p.m. To sign up for the University Collections email list, contact Alisha at alibeard@iu.edu.

It's IU's open enrollment time

It's your annual opportunity to enroll in, change, or continue IU health insurance. **Audrey Morgan**, IURA benefits liaison, says, "Retirees who have the under-65 IU health care coverage will see some changes in deductibles and new ID cards. The Blue Retiree plan premium and coverage will remain the same for 2024." HR has mailed information to those who are currently enrolled. It's also posted online at https://oe.iu.edu/retiree.html. Please note that retirees may enroll in the Blue Retiree plan only if they have not let their IU coverage lapse.

The HR website has a section that describes resources just for retirees. It outlines options for medical care, tuition benefits, and life insurance. There's a link to a page that describes UITS resources available to official retirees, including library and technology privileges. The IURA website also contains helpful links to retiree benefits.
